


Laurent Bochereau - Head of Unit International Cooperation Policy, Directorate-General for Research and Innovation (DG RTD), European Commission

Reaching out to the world

With globalisation proceeding at a fast pace, 'emerging' scientific powers are quickly catching up on the world stage. 'Old' scientific powers must increasingly position themselves in a fierce competition for talent and knowledge. But which approach to take? How to safeguard one's long-term (national) scientific interests? How to strategically choose ones partners? This Swiss Science Briefing reflects on the International Cooperation in Science and Technology (S&T) in the light of both a new INCO S&T strategy at EU level and the future Framework Programme for Research and Innovation 'Horizon 2020'.

Mauro Moruzzi will provide an overview of the Swiss policy and programmes for international cooperation in S&T from a government perspective. A committed actor of the European Research Area and active on the world stage, Switzerland has recently revised its national strategy for international cooperation in S&T with a clear set of geographical priorities and original implementation concepts that fit its limited resources and bottom-up scientific culture. Switzerland also runs a worldwide network of 'classical' S&T Counsellors combined with innovative 'Swissnex' offices which engage in knowledge diplomacy in a form that has won the praise of many.

Jean-Luc Barras will elaborate on the international cooperation instruments of the Swiss National Science Foundation, Switzerland's main research funding organisation. He will focus on aspects related to the bi- and multilateral collaboration between research funding organisations worldwide, but also with other funding bodies in Switzerland (such as the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation). He will also discuss the synergies and challenges that arise between actors working at the political and at the research funding level.

Laurent Bochereau will take a stance from a European perspective on the issue of international cooperation in S&T and its wider implications for the development of science and science policy in Europe. He will describe the European Union's new strategy for international cooperation in research and innovation.
