One of the principles of the European Waste Shipment Regulation is that waste for recycling and recovery should be able to move to the facility where it can be treated in line with the waste hierarchy. In practice, however, such shipments are often subject to restrictions and bureaucratic burdens.

In addition to the existing practical problems for shipments within the EU, the political framework at global level is also changing constantly. Already earlier this year, China implemented bans and strong restrictions on the import of many different waste streams.

FEAD invites you to a discussion on open markets for waste for recovery.

Questions will include:

- How can shipments of waste for recovery within the EU contribute in achieving the transition towards a circular economy?
- What are the most pressing problems hampering the „internal market“ for waste for recovery in the EU and how can we overcome them?
- Do we need harmonised definitions and end-of-waste criteria to facilitate transboundary movements?
- What will be the impacts of Brexit on the trade in waste between the UK and the EU?
